***Obtain your UNC Asheville OneCard.** Visit the OneCard Office and have your OneCard (which is your UNC Asheville Identification Card) created. The OneCard Office is located on the bottom level of Highsmith Union and is accessed through the exterior of the building, adjacent to the bookstore.

Register for parking via the Public Safety website. You can register for your parking permit by going to transportation.unca.edu/student-parking.

Submit your immunization records to UNC Asheville's Health & Counseling staff at the Immunizations Table in Highsmith Union. If you have questions regarding Student Health Insurance, or need to establish a continuity of care plan, be sure to visit with staff from our Health and Counseling Office to address any of these needs.

Advisors will be available in the OneStop Office, which is located on the 1st Floor of Ramsey Library, to briefly address any walk-in questions your student may have about the curriculum or fall 2018 course registration.

The Financial Aid Office is located on the second floor in Brown Hall (adjacent to the Admissions Office).

The Student Accounts Office is located on the bottom floor of Ramsey Library (inside the OneStop Office).
